

TOLL / BP DELIVER DRIVERS ON STRIKE

WHY ARE THE DRIVERS ON STRIKE?

The drivers are fighting for a fair pay rate from the Australian owned company Toll. Toll is contracted by oil giant BP. Toll/BP drivers are the lowest paid in the region, yet the price of fuel is still the same at the pump.

WHAT DO THE DRIVERS WANT?

The drivers are seeking a moderate pay increase. It would still see Toll paying the lowest rates in the industry.

WHAT ARE THE DRIVERS CONDITIONS?

These drivers have years of experience, work shifts (3 days, 3 nights, 3 off) and drive truck and trailer units for up to 13 hours a day carrying explosive petroleum. It is a very dangerous job with any incident possibly affecting both the driver and the general public. For this they are paid as little as \$20 per hour flat rate.

WHY IS BP RESPONSIBLE FOR TOLL EMPLOYEES?

Toll management are blaming BP for the low wages. They say that BP doesn't allow them enough money to pay all their drivers even \$26 per hour. Regardless of whether this is true, as the lead firm in the supply chain, BP have a corporate responsibility to ensure they use safe and ethical contractors in their supply chain.

WILL THE DRIVERS GETTING A PAY INCREASE PUSH THE COST OF FUEL UP?

All the other oil companies pay their drivers much higher rates but the price of petrol is still the same at the pump. This is a simple case of the big guy exploiting the little guys.
